Narrative Essay-tells a story

- * Told from a defined point of view, often the author's-specific and often sensory details provided to get the reader involved in the elements and sequence of the story.
- * Makes a point and that point is often defined in the opening sentence, but can also be found as the last sentence in the opening paragraph.
- Often is written in the form of a story-includes all the conventions of storytelling.
- * Usually filled with details that are carefully selected to explain, support, or embellish the story. All of the details relate to the main point the writer is attempting to make.

Expository Essay-Explains a topic

- * Requires to investigate an idea, evaluate evidence, expound on the idea, and set forth an argument concerning that idea in a clear and concise manner.
- * Written objectively-based of facts, statistics, or specific details from the source.
- Void of any emotion.
- Neutral in tone purely informative.

Speculative Essay-An Educated Guess

- Presents a hypothesis.
- Based on a reasonable possibility that has not yet been proven in fact or testing.
- Seems to give a logical explanation.

Reflective Essay-Philosophical Analysis

- * Aimed to reflect a personal event or experience.
- * Main condition-has to be a certain personal experience on which the author has his very own perception.
- * This experience or event is revealed to demonstrate its importance for understanding social relations and the essence of people.
- * Possess the traits of a philosophical analysis of different experiences we face in our everyday life.
